

Packing List, Vocabulary Review Game.

Collect 27 items that can easily be found at home such as: t-shirt, toothbrush, sock, battery, etc. (see full example list below).

First, you introduce all the items as a group, demonstrating their use and have the students repeat the words loudly.

Next, you divide your students in groups and each group's teacher/assistant takes a few (5 or so) items with him/her to review the items in their group saying: "What is this?" "It's a"

The teachers/assistants rotate to each group with their items so that each team can practice **all** the objects for about 3 to 5 minutes.

Then, one student of a group, selected by the group members, comes up the front. There, all the 27 items are laid out on a table and there is a shopping bag to fill.

Now, a volunteer writes 10 items on a blackboard. The student **cannot see this list on the blackboard yet.**

When you say "go", the student may look at the blackboard, grab the 10 items within 1 minute and put them in the bag. The students of his/her group may help their friends by shouting the names of the items (in English only).

Other groups must disturb this by shouting even louder.

After one minute, the items are checked and each correct item brings one point.

For the next group, let the volunteer write a new mix of 10 items on the blackboard etc.
